Aaron T. Stephenson, 45, of San Diego, CA, died on Monday, January 9, 2023 at Scripps Hospital in LaJolla, CA. Mass of Christian burial will be held at St. Michael's Catholic Church in Central City, on Friday, January 20, 2023 at 10:30 a.m. with Father David Fulton officiating. Visitation will be on Thursday, January 19, 2023 from 5-7 p.m. at the Catholic Church, with a 7 p.m. vigil service. Interment will be held at Central City Cemetery.

Aaron was born to Tom and Karen (Krings) Stephenson in Omaha on July 26, 1977. He grew up in Central City, and graduated from Central City High School in 1996. While in high school, he became an EMT for Central City. He worked part time for Elton King in the Summer and the Central City Mall. He attended Creighton Paramedic School and then worked at Rural Metro. Aaron then worked for Rural Metro in Lincoln. He transferred to Rural Metro in Ft. Worth, Texas where he met and married Jody Stephenson on June 14, 2003. He moved to San Diego, California and worked at AMR and recently worked for Occupational Services. Aaron's dedication to saving lives as a paramedic continued on by him saving other lives as an organ donor.

Arron enjoyed leatherwork, cooking, and soap box derby where his son

competed at Nationals in Akron, Ohio. He was a “jack of all trades”. He was involved in his kids FFA, coached his daughters in soccer, and his son in Little League Baseball.

He was preceded in death by his grandparents; Lydia and Earl Stephenson, and Lillian Krings, his uncle; Michael Stephenson, and numerous cousins.

“ *Stephenson family and friends, I'm sorry for your loss. Aaron and I crossed paths a lot in middle school and high school. We were in DARE or CODA together. I remember specifically going on a trip to the Omaha Zoo for one of those programs in the Stephensons' van and when we broke off into groups or partners, Aaron and I were one of the groups. We had a lot of laughs that day. Another time we were partnered at a station in the "haunted woods" in Central City about 1992 or so. Aaron had some light up Freddy Kruger hands that he let me wear. The idea was that I would emerge from behind a tree slowly with these blinking hands and making zombie sounds. Most people weren't too impressed or scared with that after a couple of runs, so Aaron had a new plan. As I would emerge the same way and distract them, he would run out from the dark from the other side and yell at them. That did the trick. People would say "lame" to me coming out, and I'm thinking - oh just wait about 2 more seconds. Aaron would jump out and scare the you know what out of them. Good stuff. Later we worked together at Central City Mall, had a lunch period in high school where we talked frequently, and then Aaron would play football with us across the street from the Stephenson's every now and then among other things. I lost track of him as people do after high school, but I am not surprised to learn about his career path- seems like a great fit. Rest in Peace, Aaron.*
