



Clarence "Stu" Stuart

October 2, 1938 - January 22, 2016

Clarence A. "Stu" Stuart, 77, of Central City, died on Friday, January 22, 2016 at the University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha. Clarence A. Stuart was born to Dick and Nettie (Everett) Stuart on October 2, 1938. He lived his whole life in Central City and graduated from Central City High School in 1957. He then enlisted into the United States Army, serving his country from 1958 until his honorable discharge in 1960. Stu enjoyed spending time with his children; Shirley and Bill, until he found his best friend, Sylvia Boyd, whom he married on November 25, 1978. They shared their lives together for 38 years. This union added to the family, Michelle, Troy, and John Flodman.

After being employed at various jobs in Central City, Stu and Sylvia purchased Freelend Greenhouse where Stu's passion for horticulture thrived. Throughout Stu's life he was a member of the Central City Volunteer Fire Department for 23 years.

Stu's passion for fishing, lead to South Padre Island during winter months following his "retirement" from the greenhouse. Stu also enjoyed hunting, card playing, the greenhouse, and spending time with his family.

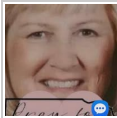
