Dennis Cash, age 64, formerly of Central City, Nebraska, now residing in Houston, Texas, passed away of an apparent heart attack at his home in Houston on February 18, 2015. Memorial services will be held on Saturday, March 7, 2015 at 10:00 A.M. at Wagner Funeral Home in Central City with Reverend Kerry Relihan officiating. There will be no visitation. After the service, burial will be in Grand Island City Cemetery.

Dennis was born on January 26, 1951 in Central City to Leslie and Bernadine (Struebing) Cash. He grew up on the farm with his sister Donna, and two brothers, David and Daniel, and mother Bernadine, and father Leslie. Dennis graduated from Central City High School in 1969, and attended York College and Oklahoma Christian University. He moved to Houston, Texas during his senior year at OCU and began working for Chicago Bridge and Iron. During Dennis's career, he not only worked with CBI, but with his business partner Victor Hart, founded World Wide Security Services in Houston, and now for many years has worked in furniture sales, the last five years with Ashley Furniture in Houston.

Dennis was baptized into the Church in 1972.
