



## Diane M. Morgan

January 25, 1945 - July 1, 2017

Diane M. Morgan, 72, of Dannebrog, died on Saturday, July 1, 2017 at University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha. Funeral services will be on Thursday, July 6, 2017 at 11 a.m. at St. John's Kronborg Lutheran Church near Marquette with Pastor Kristine Schroeder officiating. Visitation will be on Thursday, July 6th from 9-11 a.m. at the church. Burial will be at the St. John's Kronborg Lutheran Church Cemetery.
