Lyle worked as an over the road truck driver after being honorably discharged from the Marines. Lyle resided in California for 26 years but came back to Nebraska often to see friends and family. He was known for his sense of

humor and loyalty to friends and family.

Lyle was above all, my friend. I was a Corporal when I check in to 3/1, and he was a young Private First Class. We were together for 4 years in 3/1. I was head of the Forward Air controllers (FACs) in the communications platoon and we controlled the air space by directing helicopter and fixed wing attacks on the enemy. Lyle was one of my “kids.” He was so smart! A great communicator, great at math as well, which was required for the job. In Desert Storm, our commander approached me and said, “Get one of your Marines as your both being attached to Light Armored Recon, for the invasion. You’re going to control air support for them.” I immediately picked Lyle. We went to the border of Kuwait, I coordinated with the cobra helicopter pilots and we were ready. But the mission was cancelled and we returned to base. That’s how much confidence I had in him. He was a great Marine! And a great friend. My wife and I have known him since 1988. I can write a whole book on our friendship. I miss him very much! I look forward to sharing our stories at the service. Semper Fi Lyle.
